

#### **BACKGROUND**

The City of Toronto chose to install a 172 kW, solar pool heating system at the Centennial Recreation Centre to collect heat from the sun and deliver it to the indoor swimming pool. Designed to reduce the need for a conventional natural gas pool heating system, the system will function during the Spring, Summer and Fall when there is no risk of freezing.

# **MONITORING**

A flow meter was installed during Summer 2011 that will enable more accurate data measurement.

# **FINANCIAL**

The City of Toronto. through the Energy Retrofit Program, funded 61% of the project with Natural Resources Canada contributing \$13,375 and the Toronto Atmospheric Fund contributing \$26,393 towards monitoring and reporting.
